CALL FOR PAPERS

After two conferences in Genoa, this year's *Aretai* annual conference will be held at the European University of Rome. The main purpose of the conference is to investigate the link between virtue theory and current psychological research. The conference aims at inquiring into the connections between virtue ethics and different branches of psychology from a methodological, conceptual and applied perspective, with special focus on educational implications. We aim at gathering scholars interested in the virtues from both a philosophical and a psychological approach, who can contribute to the advancement of a plausible, empirically-informed virtue-ethical program.

With the aim of including as many contributions as possible, the conference will be structured around plenary sessions with lectures given by the invited speakers, and parallel sessions with the contributed papers selected by double blind review. The contributed papers should last 30 minutes (presentation + discussion). Abstracts of about 500 words (references included), prepared for blind refereeing, should be sent as email attachments to wirtuesrome@gmail.com.

Possible contributions should refer to (at least) one of the three following sections and address one or more of their thematic areas:

1. Methodology

Relationship between the normative dimension of virtue ethics and the descriptive one of psychology

Possible fruitful interaction between virtue ethics and psychology

Positive and social psychology as powerful resources for inquiring into the nature of virtues Virtue as a character trait empirically plausible

Psychological research on the idea of the primacy of virtues over general norms

2. Addressing the situationist challenge

Prediction ofthinking, feeling, and acting from situational factors. Virtues as global or local traits
Distinction between high-fidelity virtues and low-fidelity virtues
The thesis of the unity or reciprocity of the virtues
The so-called "surprising dispositions"

3. Educational applications

Psychological evidence on virtue acquisition Virtue-as-skill paradigm
